Stone Well Garden

This lovely garden and Monarch Butterfly Waystation gets its name from the Resort's original stone well and its design and care from Wendy, White Point's devoted gardener. Fencing is used to keep our rabbit friends out, and now, our chess lovers in.

The Stone Well Garden was created to support birds and insects by including plants that provide nectar, pollen, seeds, and habitat.

Many of the Stone Well plants were started from seed in our greenhouse. The beds are fertilized with compost made on-site with kitchen waste.

Our wildlife visitors include small birds, hummingbirds, butterflies, moths and many types of bees, wasps, flies and hornets. Because the Stone Well Garden is a Monarch Butterfly habitat, we have included milkweed – the food source for the precious Monarch caterpillars.
